THE 101: THE HIGHER ED POLL OF TEXAS TO BE RELEASED WEDNESDAY, JAN. 23, 2019 First-Ever Collaborative Poll Will Reveal Texans' Attitudes Regarding Higher Education

(AUSTIN, TEXAS) — Non-profit, online university, WGU Texas, the Independent Colleges & Universities of Texas (ICUT), and the Texas Association of Community Colleges (TACC) will release the results of The 101: The Higher Ed Poll of Texas (The 101) on Wednesday, Jan. 23 in Austin. WGU Texas has convened a statewide higher education poll for the past three years, but this year marks the first collaboration with other higher education entities. The 101, which examines key public concerns and attitudes about higher education statewide, was conducted by independent researchers James Henson, Ph.D. and Joshua Blank, Ph.D. of Strategic Research Associates, (SRATEX, LLC.)

The 101 explores the opinions of Texans on a wide range of higher education issues regarding the value of a college degree, affordability and student debt.

"As WGU Texas celebrates its 10,000th graduate and nearly 12,000 current students, we are proud to convene this poll with two of the state's most highly respected higher education associations as a public service to Texas," said WGU Texas Chancellor Steven Johnson.
