Institutional Authorization

WGU is known in North Carolina as "Western Governors University North Carolina" or "WGU North Carolina." WGU North Carolina was established on October 5, 2017. WGU is approved by the University of North Carolina System and offers its programs under that authority.

Licensure Pathway

Candidates applying for a teaching license in North Carolina will use either the approved licensure pathway or the direct licensure pathway, depending on their program. Information on which pathway a certain program utilizes is available here. An approved licensure pathway is available when a WGU education program is approved in a state. A candidate may apply for a license in that state based on state program approval. Not all programs are approved in all states. Direct licensure is available when a state allows candidates to be licensed upon completion of a program that is approved in the state of Utah. Candidates apply for licensure upon WGU confirming completion of an out-of-state program. They are not required to obtain a Utah license. Complete details on licensure requirements in the state of North Carolina can be found in the licensure handbook.
