Institutional Authorization

Licensure Pathway

Candidates applying for a teaching license in Vermont do so through the direct licensure pathway. Direct licensure is available when a state allows candidates to be licensed upon completion of a program that is approved in the state of Utah. Candidates apply for licensure upon WGU confirming completion of an out-of-state program. They are not required to obtain a Utah license. Complete details on licensure requirements in the state of Vermont as well as information on applying using the direct licensure pathway can be found in the <u>licensure handbook</u>.

Licensed Vermont educators can apply to add additional endorsements to their current Level I or Level II teaching license after passing the required Praxis content knowledge exam in the new area of licensure sought and after completing the coursework requirements (at least 18 credit hours) as prescribed by the Vermont Department of Education.
